Aim of Activity	To improve access to afterhours primary care services for vulnerable populations, including older adults and children 0 – 4 years old (and their families).
Description of Activity	The After Hours Service Response will apply a place-based, integrated care approach aimed to reduce potentially preventable hospital admissions in the after-hours period. Objectives: 1. Improved understanding of the contributing factors to potentially preventable hospitalisations in the after-hours period 2. Work with key stakeholders to enhance service models and referral pathways to improve coordination of after-hours GP services or medical deputising services (where current availability and access does not meet local needs). 3. Develop and commission after hours service responses for targeted locations and priority population groups, focussing on the development of sustainable funding models. Expected outcomes: - Reduction in potentially-preventable hospitalisations and associated average length of stay - Reduction in after-hours attendances at emergency departments - Increased awareness of after-hours services available in the region - Delivery of safe, reliable, quality care for older adults in their home and in RACFs in the after-hours period.

Needs Assessment Priority	Improve availability and awareness of, and access to, primary care services (including after-hours services) within the Brisbane South PHN region (p75). Improve health literacy in the region, particularly for vulnerable communities
Aim of Activity	To reduce inappropriate emergency department presentations, particularly during the after-hours period, for conditions that could be more appropriately managed in the primary care setting.
Description of Activity	This activity is designed to expand on a program implemented by Brisbane South PHN in 2017. Despite the availability of after-hours services, feedback from Emergency Departments is that there continues to be a number of after-hours presentations for conditions that could be more appropriately managed in the primary care setting. This has traditionally been further exacerbated during winter, with the onset of the cold and flu season. Objectives: 1. In collaboration with Metro South Hospital and Health Service, implement a behavioural research and community education campaign to: a. improve awareness of the options for accessing after hours services and help people make appropriate informed choices when accessing services b. assist to reduce the burden in inappropriate emergency department presentations 2. As identified in AH 7.1, the in need population groups and locations have been identified and a targeted, time-limited ED avoidance campaign will be implemented Expected outcomes: - Improved consumer health literacy - Reduced inappropriate emergency department presentations, reduction in after-hours attendances at emergency departments
